

FOR SECOND YEAR, WALDEN NAMED TO CCSU EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING HONOR ROLL

On Friday, April 26 Central Connecticut State University (CCSU) presented the 2018 Excellence in Teaching (EIT) Awards to one full-time and one part-time faculty member. Robert Kagan of Avon was the recipient of the Part-time award.

KC member and one of the group's co-founders, **Joan Walden** was one of 55 faculty members named to the EIT Honor Roll.

"In 2002 Bob Kagan hired me to teach a course at MCC," she recalled. It was the beginning of my second career as a college instructor, and I have found it to be a meaningful and stimulating occupation." Walden has taught writing, film studies, public speaking and other communication courses at the University of Hartford and Tunxis Community College. She has been an adjunct in CCSU's Communication Department



since 2009. Presently, she is working there full-time as an "emergency hire."

For over a decade Kehilat Chaverim has been assembling and delivering welcome bags to The Bridge for distribution to young girls who seek the organization's services when they need emergency shelter.

This past June, Harriet Winograd, Marcey Munoz, and I sorted items and packed a dozen bags. When we dropped them off, we were fortunate to meet the Bridge's Senior Program Director, Maiya Pierre. She expressed appreciation for our donations and asked that we check back with her concerning how many bags will be needed going forward. Our goal has been to make three or four deliveries a year.

We also met Doreen Tarascio, director of communications. She took pictures for their Facebook page.

This ongoing program was initiated by Maggie Cohen, who determined that it was an unfilled need that our group could meet on an ongoing basis. Grateful thanks to everyone who supports this effort every year, both at High Holiday services with contributions of items and funds, and throughout the year by helping supplement our supply of items and assisting in sorting and assembling the bags.

The need for supplies for the girls at the Bridge STAR Home in West Hartford is ongoing, and they count on us to provide welcome bags for their new residents.

Lighting Yahrzeit Candle

A Yahrzeit Candle is lit traditionally on the following days:

- Each day during the week of Shiva (mourning) immediately following a death.
- Every year at sundown on the eve of the Yahrzeit (anniversary of the death).
- Every year at sundown preceding the start of <u>Yom Kippur</u> and at sundown preceding the last day of the holidays of <u>Sukkot</u>, <u>Passover</u> and <u>Shavuot</u>. These times are when the Yizkor Memorial Prayer Service is held.

There are those who say the following words while lighting the candle:

"I light this candle to bring peace to the soul of _____(insert Jewish name) ben/bat (son of/daughter of) _____ (insert father's Jewish name)."

If the Jewish name of the deceased (or the deceased's father) is not known, the secular name may be used.


