**Kehilat Chaverim invites you to join us for the 2021-2022 year**

Kehilat Chaverim is an all-inclusive group that was established in 1978 as an alternative to a traditional synagogue. Until March 2020, services, observances and events were held in members' homes and public locations. We welcome people who wish to participate in Jewish culture and observance while offering support and friendship to one another throughout life's stages in an affordable and accessible community.

A fundamental precept is the requirement that our members design, organize, staff, and run all of our programs. The group's governance is overseen by a Steering Committee of 11-13 people. The group comprises approximately 70 households and welcomes Jewish, interfaith, and LGBTQ couples and individuals. Ages range from young to ripe.

About the dues: Thanks to an all-volunteer group, we have maintained a low dues structure which has remained unchanged for at least 20 years. However, if anyone is not in a position to pay all or some of the dues we will accommodate your needs.

## COMMITTEE CHOICES:

### Community Action - Clarissa Basch\* 860-680-8389

Organizes community outreach efforts, coordinates volunteer opportunities, and participates in activities. Recent projects have included preparing meals and serving at a soup kitchen, collecting bags and items for the girls at The Bridge, sorting and bagging produce at Foodshare's Regional Market, and running a turkey drive.

### Festivals- Ellen Coffey\* 860 212-4873 and Harriet Winograd\* 860 869-1921

Plans activities for Sukkot, Hanukkah, Purim and Passover, and coordinates with the Shabbat Committee when appropriate. Past celebrations have included outdoor Sukkot Shabbat potluck dinners and services; Hanukkah parties (coupled one year with an Empty Bowls fundraiser); Purim "Rock Operas" and costume parties; and Passover-themed activities such as recipe tastings, a guest speaker on creative seder ideas, and a gathering at a paint your own pottery studio to create original Seder plates and Elijah's/Miriam's cups.

### Lifelong Learning -- Sue Garten\*860 798-5938 and Hila Yana 860-690-5420

The focus of this committee is to organize and facilitate diverse programs for the membership. Community Engagement activities have included Pop up Salons at which members have discussed a range of topics such as current events, Jewish identity, and the book Being Mortal. The committee also organized an outing to see and discuss a film that was part of the Jewish Film Festival. The Education/Culture mission of the committee is to present educational programs on Jewish history and culture. As examples, we have two speakers lined up for Winter/Spring 2021: Author Hanna Marcus will discuss her book "Sidonia's Thread", and Professor Avinoam Patt will present a program on Jewish Humor.

### Marketing & Communications - Dan Haar\* 860-983-8503

Plans, coordinates, and publishes the bi-monthly newsletter and maintains the website. Responsible for determining content of newsletter and website and researching/writing/collecting/editing articles pertaining to Judaism, members, and the larger Jewish community. Develops special projects (such as a 2012 Challah calendar) to foster pride in the group and to use as a public relations tool. Oversees the collection of photos for media distribution and advises on the writing and distribution of media releases. Designs and places ads in appropriate publications and program books.

Helps integrate new members. Maintains information on referrals and resources for life-cycle events and other special needs of members. Responds to personal and family life-cycle events. Coordinates Annual Fall Membership Meeting.

### Shabbat -Susan Doran\* 860 384-8262

Coordinates monthly Sabbath services in members' homes in months when there is not a Jewish holiday that KC celebrates as a group. Hosts determine the date and time as well as the format of the event and the service: a full or abbreviated service; a potluck dinner or just dessert; Friday night or Saturday Havdalah. Committee responsibilities include calendar planning, recruiting hosts, advertising gatherings, assisting hosts with shopping, set up and clean up, and reimbursing hosts for expenses. During COVID-19, ZOOM services were utilized when colder weather and earlier sunsets made backyard, socially distanced services impractical.

The goal of this committee is to create fun experiences for fellowship and getting to know each other better. Former events included going to Playhouse on Park, Hartford Yard Goats, museum outings, the Yiddish Book Center and the 40th Anniversary Party.
