Dear KC Members and Friends,

At its October 19, 2021 meeting, the KC Steering Committee had a robust discussion regarding what our Covid protocols should be for KC-sponsored, in-person, indoor events. We all agreed that taking care of each other's wellbeing is the paramount consideration both in common sense and in Jewish life.

The in-depth and lengthy discussion covered many options and variations of protocols. Ultimately, the Committee voted to require proof of vaccination and indoor mask-wearing at all KC-sponsored events which, sadly, means no food can be served. If members are willing to have their proof of vaccination recorded on a list, that would eliminate having to show proof at subsequent events. The Steering Committee agreed that this protocol will be revisited as CDC guidelines and community conditions change.

We all hope the day comes soon when this protocol is no longer necessary.

Meet the artist Brad Robinson and browse his dynamic show. Select items will be shown at this reception that will not be shown elsewhere in the library. Registration not required.




